Disadvantages of Mazatlán

- It's hot in the summertime, and reaches 90° (32°C)... but at least it's a <u>humid</u> heat.
- Busy/noisy during peak periods, especially in Golden Zone
 - Lots of Canadians and Americans in winter... Popular all year with Mexicans, especially on holiday weekends.

(These crowds are an advantage if you're renting your property out)

Getting to Mazatlán

- 1:40 hours flight time to Phoenix or LAX
- Nonstops to Phoenix, Los Angeles, Dallas, Houston, and Minneapolis
- Nonstops to Vancouver, Abbotsford, Edmonton, Calgary, Winnipeg and Toronto.
- 13.5 hours drive time from Arizona border, 37 hours to Alberta border

- Gated communities attached to each...


Boating in Mazatlan

- Mostly Car-dependent












